Brief Program Description:

Our department addresses a wide range of referral questions, such as psychiatric differential diagnosis, cognitive strengths and weaknesses; cognitive and behavioral impacts of general medical, neurological, and psychiatric disease; learning disability evaluations; personality and interpersonal functioning; adaptive functioning, etc. The students will receive a wide range of training in different types of psychological assessments, including therapeutic approaches to assessment. Externs will be expected to conduct psychological assessments with adult populations. In general, adult cases will be approached from a biopsychosocial standpoint.

Title and Hours required:

Doctoral student from an APA-accredited program in clinical or counseling psychology, 20+ hours/week, 12-month commitment. We prefer a start date in July, but this is somewhat flexible.

Minimum Qualifications and # of openings:

1-2 openings for 3rd year or beyond doctoral students. Must have completed all program requirements for assessment coursework and have administered the Rorschach Inkblot Method as part of an assessment battery. Applicants should demonstrate a strong interest in psychological and personality assessments, as this is an intensive placement solely focused on psychological assessment. Must have good interviewing, test administration, and report writing skills. You will be asked to provide a sample report at the time of your interview.

Duties of Placement and Miscellaneous Information:

Aim of skill development includes: Appropriate battery development, test administration, clinical interviewing, coordination with providers, medical record review, scoring, report writing, and providing feedback to clients and collaterals, primary providers, as well as coordinate, as needed, with involved systems of care (i.e. outside medical or psychological providers).
