Brief Program Description: Child & Family Intensive Treatment Services

The Intensive Treatment Services Team provides home-based services to youth and their families who are struggling with a variety of mental health challenges. These may include children who are at-risk of out-of-home placement or hospitalization. Intensive Treatment Services are for families where the traditional outpatient model might not provide enough support.

Intensive Treatment Services' therapeutic approach emphasizes a strengths-based perspective along with a trauma-informed integrative modality. We work with children in the context of the family system, provided in the community where the child lives, and are tailored to the individualized needs of the family. This work is short-term with the goal of stabilization, family cohesion, and improved family dynamics.

Title and Hours required:

- Clinical Therapist Intern – Home Based
- 16-20 hours a week with a 9-month commitment following the school academic year from August/September to May/June.

Minimum Qualifications and # of openings:

- Second year MSW student

- One opening

Student Supervisor's Credential Level: LCSW

Duties of Placement and Miscellaneous Information:

Following an initial period of training and shadowing opportunities, the student intern will ultimately develop an individual caseload of children/families to provide therapeutic interventions. Caseloads can be tailored to the interests of the student. Some of the duties of individual students will include initial assessment and diagnosis, individual therapy, family therapy, group therapy, play therapy, case management, and psycho-education. Student will also be expected to document clinical interactions. Students will participate in a minimum of one hour of weekly individual supervision while also having the opportunity to participate in additional small group supervisions, case consultations and team meetings.
